ORIENTATION FOR DELEGATES

Introduction:

Classis consists of three delegates from each member congregation — a pastor, an elder and a deacon. First-time delegates are asked to sign the *Covenant for Officebearers* at the registration desk. *Delegate Credentials* are processed by the church council and are to be submitted by the Council, to the Stated Clerk via email prior to the classis meeting by your council clerk.

Duration of Classis Meetings

• The meetings normally are held on Tuesdays. Start time is determined based on the length/needs of the agenda.

Classis Agenda:

- The Classis Agenda will, ordinarily, be in the hands of church councils eight weeks prior to the actual meeting date of classis. This is done to allow each church council to review the agenda prior to sending delegates.
- Delegates are to thoroughly familiarize themselves with the classis agenda. The assumption is that the agenda has been discussed at the delegates' local council meetings.

Executive of Classis

- The Executive consists of a Chair, Vice-Chair and the Stated Clerk. A Reporter is also appointed for each meeting and serves as the Vice-Chair at the next subsequent meeting.
- The chair is elected by classis in its October meeting to serve during the following calendar year. The vice-chair is appointed by rotation and the stated clerk is elected annually at the May classis meeting.

What May I Expect to Happen at Any One Classis Meeting?

- First time delegates are to sign the Covenant for Officebearers.
- The Classis Agenda will, ordinarily, be in the hands of church councils eight weeks prior to the actual meeting date of classis, and so delegates should have it at that time as well.
- Delegates may be requested to serve in the following capacities:
 - **Prayer:** for the ministries of classis, concerns of classis and/or for individuals.
 - Committee work:
 - Delegates in teams of two churches may be asked to serve on one of its advisory committees, Credentials, Ad hoc (as determined by previous Classis or Classis Interim Committee) or Overtures & Appeals. They are expected to submit their recommendations at least three weeks prior to the classis meeting.
- Though there is a degree of flexibility (especially where there is silence on a matter), classis abides by its own Rules of Procedure together with the rules of the CRCNA Church Order in conducting its meetings. The Church Order is determined by Synod and is held in covenant by all CR churches. The classis Rules of Procedure are at:

What Are Classis' Expectations of Me?

- Be on time for all sessions of classis.
- Delegates are expected to review the agenda with their council, sharing the thoughts of their council on any particular agenda item. Delegates are not obligated to vote according to their council's wishes. Classis is a deliberative body and the freedom needs to remain for delegates to vote on the basis of the best information or perspective presented at classis. (*Church Order*, Article 34; & *Manual of CRC Government*, Article 34, Commentary #'s 1 4.)
- If you do not understand the procedure, or it is not clear what is being discussed, or you are uncertain of the implications of a decision, *please ask*. It is important that all delegates

- deliberate and vote with good awareness of what is going on. Classis would rather take a moment to ensure that, also for the meaningfulness of your time there, than try 'rush' through the agenda.
- You are expected to remain at classis until the meeting is formally adjourned. If there is an urgent need to leave, or if you will be replaced at some point by an alternate, you are to seek the permission of the chair who will seek the consent of the assembly.
- Be aware that classis is a deliberative body and may make decisions from time to time that you do not necessarily agree with.
- Strong objection to a decision of classis may be voiced by stating your objection. If you wish to have your objection recorded, you will need to submit a written statement (within 24 hours) indicating your objection and reason(s) why.
- Delegates should report to their councils the decisions made at the classis meeting.

What do the Acronyms Used at Classis Mean?

It is always a challenge for persons coming to a meeting of an organization to understand the shortcut language often used. Part of that shortcut language is using acronyms. Here follows a list of more common ones often heard at classis meetings.

Dear Classis Delegate: August 25, 2017

Thank you for allowing me to address you concerning an exciting opportunity that you will be voting on at your upcoming classis meeting – The Bridge App.

In strategic partnership with <u>Extreme Technology Corporation (ETC)</u>, in a tremendous answer to prayer, the CRCNA has worked closely with ETC on the development of a communications tool designed for local church members and its community. It has been developed and tested over the past two years and is now being launched across Canada with intentions of growth into the

USA. The Bridge App is a missional and community-building tool designed to bring a vast number of church needs together all in one place – with little to no additional effort by administrators within the church. Most favourably, since this is a custom-built app and platform, the future promises increased functionality based upon feedback and needs.

Prior to your attending your classis meeting, I'd like to encourage you to do three things:

- Download the app. You can access the website at: http://www.thebridgeapp.org.
 Complete download instructions can be found there. Take some time to explore all of the features the app contains. Currently, you can only join the "online app church". Once your church has been registered, you will have the ability to access a whole host of other features.

- 3. Pray that the app continues to be blessed in its effectiveness as a tool which local churches and classes can use in spreading the gospel. Pray that localized ministry continues to flourish by means of using the app as a tool.

3. CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE REPORT

Request for Assistance:

New Hope Church would like direction to know what is expected of us relating to denomination and classical shares. At each budget meeting, we raise the question, "Is it New Hope's desire to stay connected with Classis Hamilton and the CRCNA and as such, continue to pay 100% of the expected financial contribution?" Each budget meeting has resulted in affirmation of participation. Since day one, we have paid 100% of our shares (both Classis and Denomination) and we also contribute to many local ministries. In fact, last year, over half of our budget went to shares and external ministries. What is unclear to us is what is the financial expectation of New Hope Church in regards to Denominational and Classical Shares.

Request for Discussion at Classis:

New Hope Church would like Classis Hamilton to keep Church Planting as a priority. We'd also challenge Classis to consider structures and systems that both encourage and hinder church planting. There is much more opportunity for church planting that can take place, if there is interest. It will require some changes in our imagination of what church looks like, who are partners are and how it is funded. New Hope would be happy to share the story of how we have partnered and funded a church plant over the last three years and how both our church and the new church plant continue to grow.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Credential Committee recommends the following to Classis Hamilton:

- 1. That Classis acknowledge the request of New Hope
- 2. That these requests be referred to Classis Home Missions Committee (CHMC) to engage the leadership of New Hope and bring forward recommendations to Classis Hamilton

<u>Grounds</u>: After speaking with members of church leadership, CHMC, and Resonate, the credentials committee has identified that the first request is more substantial than can be covered by the scope of this committee. Although the simple answer to this request is that New Hope is not *required* to pay Denominational or Classical Ministry Shares since it is not an *organized* congregation (cf. C.O. Supplement Art. 38-b), the Credentials Committee acknowledges that the deeper question of how New Hope fits within our current classical and denominational structure needs to be addressed in the near future. The CHMC seems the most appropriate body to handle these questions.

4. ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Regarding the Proposal by the CHYMC (see Agenda, page 45)

Advisory Committee Response:

The Advisory Committee recommends that Classis Hamilton not accept the Classis Hamilton Youth Ministry Committee (CHYMC) proposal that Classis Hamilton employ a Youth Ministry Catalyst.

Grounds:

- 1. We are not convinced that this proposed position would accomplish substantively more as a Classis initiative than what each respective church can do on its own in support of their respective youth leaders.
- 2. The proposal does not indicate that the churches of Classis Hamilton, and specifically the current part-time or volunteer youth leaders, are requesting this type of assistance from Classis.
- 3. The proposal does not indicate whether the intended recipients (part time and volunteer youth leaders) have the capacity to meet with the proposed youth catalyst staff member.
- 4. Classis Hamilton previously approved John Bijl in a volunteer role of Youth Champion, at the request of the CRC's Faith Formation Ministries and the CHYMC. This volunteer role serves as a liaison between Faith Formation Ministries and the CHYMC, and has included responsibility for connecting with youth leaders from various churches in Classis Hamilton. We are uncertain as to how the proposed paid position relates to or differs in scope or substance from that volunteer role.

A Few Additional Comments:

- 1. We appreciate the willingness of the CHYMC to consider potential means of addressing issues raised in recent studies on faith formation among youth (i.e. Hemorrhaging Faith). These conversations are critical if we are to cultivate faith among our youth. However, we are not convinced that adding a Classis staff position, at least as proposed, is necessary or substantively beneficial at this point in time.
- 2. It seems to us that the proposed position has some significant overlap with current CHYMC responsibilities. Is this paid position intended to replace, duplicate, or complement most of what the committee as a whole has been tasked with doing?
- 3. We are concerned about the financial capacity of Classis Hamilton to continue supporting additional paid staff positions, particularly for efforts that the churches of Classis Hamilton could do on their own.
